The Learning Center tutoring lab is designed to enhance SUU students' learning capabilities in a professional environment. Peer tutoring in many subjects is available at no charge to the students. Assistance in organizing and facilitating study groups is also provided.

- University Orientation: UNIV 1010 & Pre-Advising
 - University Orientation (UNIV 1010) is a required course for students starting at SUU with less than 24 credits earned after graduating high school. It is designed to ease the transition to university life. Orientation will review the academic, civic, and social expectations of students at SUU. Students must be fully admitted to SUU before enrolling for University Orientation.
- First-Year Seminar: UNIV 1000
 - University 1000, First Year Seminar – a one-semester program – is designed to provide a comprehensive experience to orient students further to Southern Utah University, its functions and its expectations for academic success. The one-hour course introduces students to University resources like attentive academic advising, campus personnel and services, and opportunities for social involvement and responsibility.

Through the course, entering students set goals and develop strategies to meet those goals. The University seeks to recognize, reward, and advocate for desirable outcomes.

The Center for Women and Families has received a \$60,000 grant to help students subsidize their child care costs. It is based on a sliding scale that takes into account their Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) and the number of credits they are taking.

Parents are asked to volunteer 4 hours per month at their family's childcare facility or another facility that is preapproved by the CWF Director, remain in good financial standing with their family's childcare facility, participate once a month in a parenting workshop or program offered by the Center for Women and Families and maintain a 2.3 GPA (or better) for continued eligibility next academic year.

- **Financial Aid & Scholarship Information:**
