Student Support Services (SSS) is a federally funded TRiO program that assists students who qualify for the program to succeed in college, graduate and/or transfer to a university to obtain a Bachelor's degree. SSS strongly promotes student development by providing opportunities for students to grow personally, socially, and academically. As an SSS member, students may receive free services such as one-to-one tutoring, academic advising, transfer advising, career counseling and study-skills workshops.

- **Academic Advising:**
Students receive personalized advising regarding their career and academic goals. SSS advisors will assist you in selecting courses and register you right on the spot.
- **Career Testing and Advising:**
If you haven't selected a major yet, don't panic. Through computerized surveys, various tests, and one-on-one advising, SSS can assist you in finding the right career path for you!
- **Transfer Advising:**
As you graduate and pursue your Bachelor's Degree, SSS advisors can provide valuable information to make your transfers go smoothly.
- **Tutoring :**
SSS can provided quality tutoring in a variety of subjects all free of charge to the student.
- **Study Skills Workshops :**
We can offer tips on note-taking, effective text reading techniques, defeating test anxiety, test-taking strategies, and other topics.
- **SSS Newsletter :**
As a member, you will receive a monthly newsletter that's filled with vital information to assist your academic success.
- **Laptop Loan Program:**
SSS will check out laptop computers to participants to work on academic related work. Students can check out a laptop for 1 week, 5 nights, up to 5 times a month.

Upward Bound is an educational program designed to develop the skills and motivation necessary for students' success in education beyond high school. Is comprised of 9th-12th grade students from Carbon, Emery, Grand County, Green River, and Lighthouse High Schools and the junior high schools that feed into them. During the academic year, students meet weekly with an Upward Bound Coordinator and tutors, and they participate in one Saturday academy each month. Participants in the summer program receive instruction in mathematics, science, literature and composition, foreign language, computer applications, study skills, and other disciplines for six weeks on the College of Eastern Utah campus in Price, Utah. Students from the schools mentioned above must apply and be accepted.
