The First Year Experience (FYE) Program is designed to help incoming students make a successful transition into the university community. Any WSU student with 30 hours or fewer is welcome to participate in the program, which assists you in making progress toward fulfilling the following educational and personal goals:

- Acquiring a sense of competence as a student and becoming successful in college.
- Mastering academic skills, such as note taking, textbook reading, test-taking, and time management.
- Developing effective interpersonal skills with a variety of people.
- Engaging with the WSU community through connections with other students, teachers, mentors and WSU employees.
- Enhancing your mental, physical, spiritual, and social health.

To help you achieve these goals, the FYE Program offers the following courses and components:

- **EDUC 1105 “Introduction to the University” (3)**
This course prepares students to work efficiently in the university environment. Topics include improving study and time management skills, developing interpersonal communications, making major/career selections, and understanding student responsibilities.
- **EDUC 3170 “First-Year Experience (FYE) Mentor Leadership Seminar” (2)**
This course teaches FYE Peer Mentors to effectively assist students registered for EDUC 1105. Peer Mentors learn to work with FYE students to help them transition to the university environment, to connect them with campus resources, and to provide them with social opportunities both inside and outside class.
- **Clustered-Course Learning Communities**
A group of students registers for the same two or three courses that help satisfy general education and elective graduation requirements. EDUC 1105 is one of these cluster courses. You may also take additional classes, outside the cluster, to reach full-time status.

The Hourly Childcare Center is designed to provide flexible hourly or back-up care for the children of WSU students. Children ages two to nine years old may attend. A child may be at the center for a maximum of four hours per day, while parents are attending classes, using the computer lab, studying, or using other campus resources. There is a \$15 application fee (one-time, non-refundable). Applications are accepted on an on-going basis. The hourly rate is \$3.00/hour. Back-up care is based on availability.

- The provision of academic accommodations is not only essential to the retention of students with disabilities; it is an ethical and legal obligation of the University to ensure that all students have equal access to our programs, activities, and services regardless of disability.
- This department provides specialized services, technology, and advisement to meet the specific needs of each qualified disabled student. These services cover all generally acknowledged types of disabling conditions including certain cognitive and emotional problems (subject to documented verification) in addition to visual impairments, hearing impairments, and mobility impairments. Student Support Services (SSS) provides a variety of free services designed to help students complete a bachelor's degree. To be eligible for services, students must be either low-income, first-generation or have a documented disability, and be pursuing a bachelor's degree while enrolled full-time. Applications may be obtained in SC 265 or on-line. All SSS services are personalized and offered by a staff of professional advisors and trained peer mentors and tutors.

- **TRIO:** "Our nation has asserted a commitment to providing educational opportunity to all Americans regardless of race, ethnic background or economic circumstance.

In support of this commitment, Congress established a series of programs to help low-income Americans enter college, graduate and move on to participate more fully in America's economic and social life. These programs are funded under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and are referred to as the TRIO programs (initially just three programs). While student financial aid programs help students overcome financial barriers to higher education, TRIO programs help students overcome class, social and cultural barriers to higher education."

Student to Student allows Weber State students the opportunity to provide mentoring and tutoring assistance to students in local high schools and middle schools. Tutors provide academic support in a variety of subjects in which students may be challenged. This tutoring provides an opportunity for the university students to develop a mentoring relationship with the secondary students, offering them a glimpse into the life of someone who is continuing their education beyond high school. Students being mentored are also provided opportunities for extra-curricular activities with the university students with whom they have become acquainted. Student to Student hosts an annual summer program providing assistance and navigation through the college entrance process (admissions, scholarships, financial aid) - making college a real experience and an option for the future. Students are also provided leadership opportunities as part of the Summer Summit.

In an effort to improve the health and lives of local women, Donna Milavetz, M.D., M.P.H and Julie Hansen, M.S., R.D., C.D. developed Women in Motion -- a low cost, group training program for women with a BMI over 30. Participants meet twice a week for 16 weeks for education, strength training and walking at Weber State University. At the end of the 16 weeks, the women compete as a relay team in the Ogden Marathon.

Women in Motion is helping sedentary, overweight and obese women in Ogden make positive changes in their health. Participants of Women in Motion walk further than they thought they could, improve their health and increase their enthusiasm for physical fitness. Participants also have a positive effect on the health of their families, as their fitness goals and lifestyle changes impact those around them.
