Westminster operates rolling admissions and we are currently accepting applications. We start taking applications beginning September of your senior year. The priority deadline for financial aid is April 15 and for on-campus housing May 15. We guarantee housing for all incoming freshmen—but you MUST apply by May 15. After that time, on-campus housing becomes limited. All Westminster College applicants are considered for acceptance on the basis of his or her potential for success at Westminster. Academic preparation includes course work, grades, items such as entrance exams (ACT or SAT), recommendations, and extracurricular activities.

We know that financing a Westminster education is a big investment in your future; we will do everything we can to make a Westminster education more affordable. In 2008-2009, 91% of incoming freshmen received a renewable Westminster scholarship. The average 08-09 freshman scholarship award is \$10,520. Annual amounts for these awards range from \$6,000 (\$24,000 over four years) to \$12,000 (\$48,000 over four years). In addition, Westminster oversees a generous financial aid program: aid includes work-study, grants (both state and federal), and loans. In 2008-2009, 98% of incoming freshmen received an average financial aid award of \$18,533 (including scholarship and loan money). Transfer students are eligible for work study, loans, and, of course, scholarships and grants which range in amounts from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per year (as long as you are attending full time and maintain a 3.0 GPA).
